

### **SUPPLY LIST (September 2010) - GRADE 7/8/9**

The five core subjects for Grade 7 and 8 are Mathematics, Science, English, French and Social Studies. For Grade 9, the core subjects are Mathematics, Science, English, French and Canadian Geography. The following list of items is recommended for each student for September:

1. At least 2 sturdy 3-ring binders and a good supply of 3-ring lined binder paper, with coloured tab dividers (some subjects require several dividers each).
2. Pens, pencils (normal and coloured), eraser, ruler, stapler and pencil sharpener. A highlighter is useful when studying from notes. NOTE: Please do not bring whiteout, as it can be very messy.
3. An inexpensive calculator. Students do not normally get to use them on tests and exams in grades 7 and 8, but they are used at other times throughout the year. A calculator should always have the student's name clearly marked on it. Grade 9 students will need a 'scientific' calculator. (Note: Keep the instruction booklet!) Students in the Grade 9 computer class are recommended to have a 256 MB USB Key to transfer files to and from home.
4. For Math and Geography a Math set containing a compass, a good quality protractor, a ruler and two triangles. You should consider buying a good quality compass at a higher price as the cheap ones do not last very long and can be frustrating to use. A good compass will outlast many of the cheap ones. What to look for? The joint at the top: if it is a screw or flimsy piece of metal, it will come loose or break. The best types are adjusted with a wheel in the middle of the compass, not by the joint at the top.
5. A pad of graph paper and a 30 cm ruler is required for both Science and Math. Graph paper is essential in Grade 9.
6. For school, an English dictionary and for home, a good quality, university/college level English dictionary and thesaurus.
7. 2 non-spiral 40 page Hilroy exercise notebooks for French. A notebook for a Grade 7 English journal (can be spiral bound).
8. At least 2 transparent page protectors for French and English subjects and 4 for Science (3-ring binder size).

9. The Yorkland School student agenda book. This is a homework/date book that will be given to all students on the first day of school to be used to keep track of homework, tests, assignments, etc.
10. A Bible (New International Version) is mandatory. Student Bibles can be purchased from the school office. When purchasing a Bible, please consider a 'Student' Bible, many of which contain additional, explanatory notes.
11. Students will need to make a \$5.00 deposit on the first day of school for the school lock supplied for their second floor locker. Only school issued locks can be used on student lockers.
12. Art supplies: pencil case, wooden pencils (*not mechanical*), scissors, eraser, glue stick, small set of pencil crayons (10 pencils), protractor, triangle, short ruler and metal pencil sharpener and container for shavings.

NOTE: Everything of value should have the student's name on it. The school takes no responsibility for lost or stolen items. Please leave valuable personal items at home especially electronic devices. When something is found, it can be immediately returned if there is a name on it. Otherwise, it goes in the lost and found and may disappear.
